Introduction to Public Administration

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Course Description

This course will offer a general overview of the field of public administration by drawing on recent developments in government operations at different levels in different countries. The course is expected to familiarize students with the basic theories, principles, concerns and methods of public administration that are important for the present-day citizens as well as public officials.

Course Objectives

Students will be able to:

- Understand the basics of public administration as a field.
- Identify ways in which public organizations differ from private organizations.
- Elaborate the role of government and Public Servants.
- Explain the consequences of policies based on scientific analysis
- Discuss the tools that modern public administrators use to pursue public goals, along with the pros and cons of those tools.
- Explain the major values that public administration has and illustrate how those affect the work of government.
